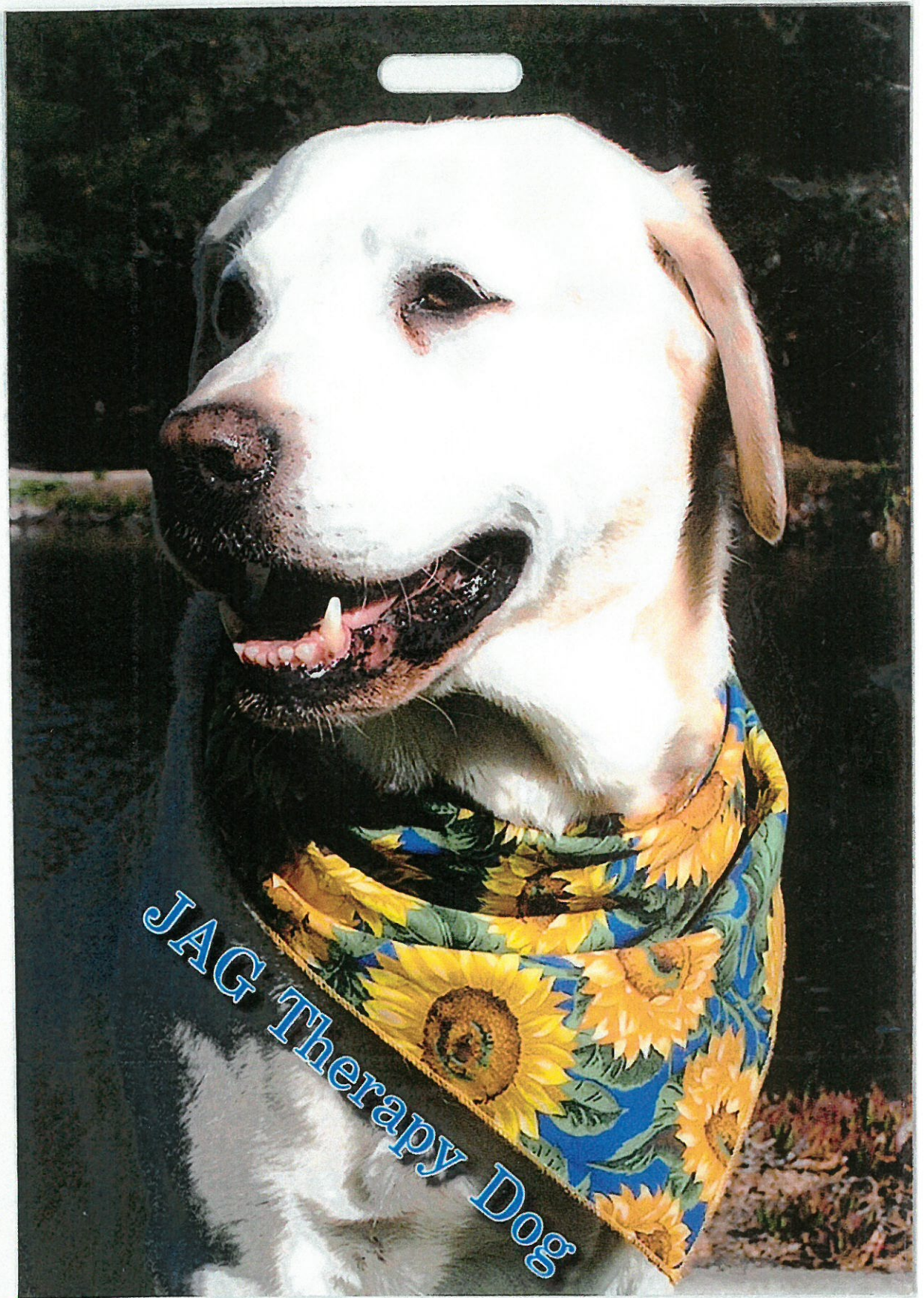

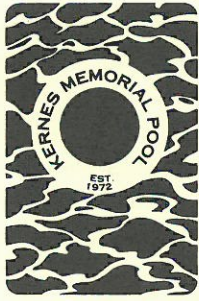

HARDEN FOUNDATION CHALLENGE!!

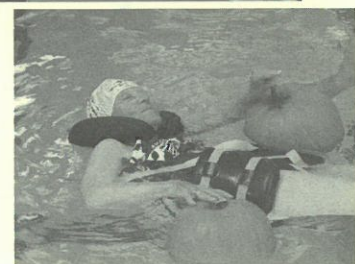

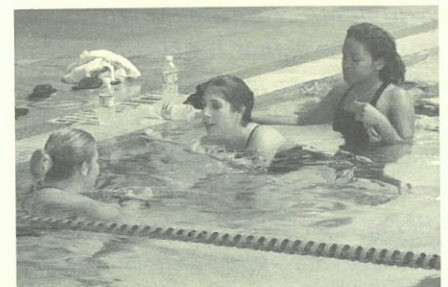
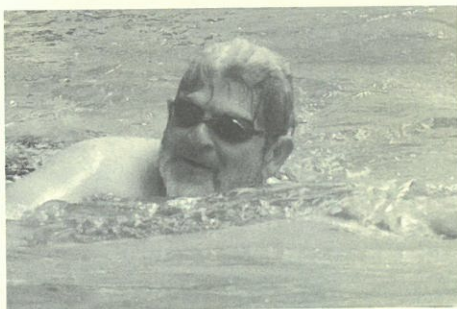
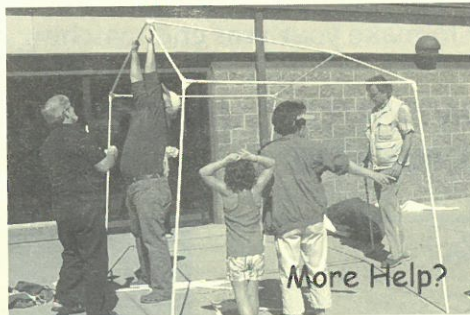
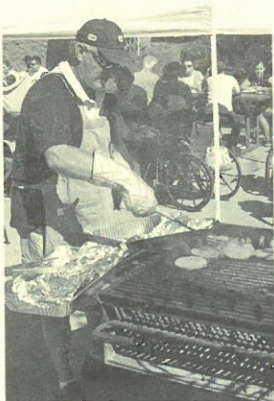
Spring cleaning in November

We apologize to those of you who have had to endure a week without the daily sessions in the pool. New laws and rules govern our facility at times and that, along with an annual maintenance were the reasons the pool was closed in November.

First, as a "commercial" pool we are required to have an automatic chlorinator system. We had one installed last year and it is run by a computer reading the balance of chemicals in the pool and adding chlorine when needed. The computer, as we all know, can be temperamental and decided to give out totally so we were required to close the pool until we got the new part.

While we were waiting for the part to arrive and be installed, we also took the opportunity to comply with a new Pool and Spa Safety Act – the Virginia Graeme Baker Pool and Spa Safety Act. This meant installing a safety vacuum release system that will automatically turn off if anything blocks the filter in the pool. It also required that we install an "unblockable" drain cover in the pool to avoid suction hazards. These were successfully installed.

We also took advantage of this downtime to drain the pool, power-wash the decks and walls, and the staff spent time doing a thorough cleaning of all the pool equipment. We would like to thank all of our clients for their patience while we took care of these responsibilities.

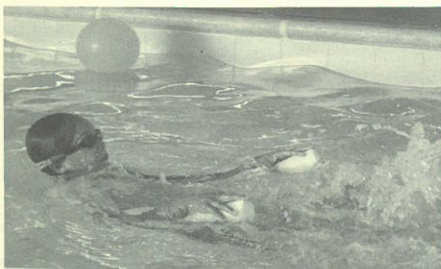
