Agenda Title: Consider Recommending for Approval by the Board of Directors the 2016

Consumer Confidence Report for the Marina Coast Water District Water System,

Central Marina and Ord Community

Staff Recommendation: The Water Conservation Commission recommend approval to the Board of Directors of the 2016 Consumer Confidence Report for the Marina Coast Water District Water System, Central Marina and Ord Community.

Background: 2017 Strategic Plan, Mission Statement – We provide our customers with high quality water, wastewater collection and conservation services at a reasonable cost, through planning, management and the development of water resources in an environmentally sensitive manner.

Discussion/Analysis: The Safe Drinking Water Act requires water utilities to provide accurate and timely information to consumers about the quality of their drinking water. The US Environmental Protection Agency and California State Water Resource Control Board, Division of Drinking Water (formerly known as the California Department of Public Health (CDPH)) adopted regulations known as a Consumer Confidence Report (CCR), to be distributed to water utility customers by July 1st each year. Since 1989, the District has provided CCR's (formerly called annual water quality report) to District customers.

The 2016 CCR summarizes the results of detected contaminants in District's supply wells and distribution systems conducted in calendar year 2016, or for some constituents, the most recent sampling year. The District's water system did not have any violation in 2016 and is in compliance with State and Federal drinking water regulations.

A list of contaminants tested for but not detected will be posted in the District's website at www.mcwd.org/2016ccr-ND.html

The 2016 CCR will be mailed together with each customer's water bill beginning May 2017 or sooner. A separate mailing will be conducted for residents in the Ord military housing at or about the same time. Copies will be distributed to Alliance Residential, businesses, apartment managers, and school administrators for further distribution to customers who do not receive a water bill directly from the District. Staff will coordinate with the US Army and CSUMB's News and Public Information Officer to establish the website links for access by the military and university communities. Summary: On March 5 2017, staff provided an overview of the Water Loss TAP program and the steps staff is taking to determine, and file with the State of California, the estimated distribution system water loss in 2016. The report is to be completed and filed by October 1, 2017.

Highlights of the working group meeting include discussions about the following: water supplies, water production, categories of authorized consumption, types of water losses, non-revenue water, water system data, water cost data, and water loss performance indicators.

Subject: Review the proposed 2017-2018 MCWD Water Conservation Rebate Program

Budgets

Summary: At two consecutive WCC working group meetings in February and March of 2017, staff presented the 2016-2017 budgets for District rebates and incentives. Prior to an open discussion about budget changes for the 2017-2018 fiscal year, staff provided some background and statistics on each rebate and incentive.

Overall, the net change in rebates and incentives from 2016-2017 to 2017-2018 is an increase of \$8,000. The following paragraphs highlight the proposed changes to the rebates and incentives for the 2017-18 fiscal year:

I. High-efficiency Clothes Washer Rebates

- a. Update rebate tiers to provide rebates to only most efficient clothes washers. The net results would result in reduced clothes washer rebate expenditures.
- b. Adjust budgets for each service area according to 2016-2017 demand and projected demands.
 - i. Reduce Marina budget \$7,000 to \$10,500
 - ii. Ord budget remains the same at \$7,500

II. High-efficiency Toilet Rebates

- a. Promote more toilet retrofitting in Ord service area (More old toilets found here) and increase budget to allow more retrofitting projects. One \$35,000 project approved.
 - i. Increase Ord budget \$10,000 to \$50,000
- b. Reduce budget in Marina Service area in response to 2016-2017 demand not meeting expectations. Yet, provide \$10,000 for special projects above expected demand.
 - i. Reduce Marina budget by \$10,000 to \$30,000.

III. Hot Water Recirculation Pump Installations

- a. Adjust budgets for each service area according to 2016-2017 demand and projected demands.
- b. Reduce Ord budget by \$500 to \$1,000
- c. Increase Marina budget by \$500 to \$4,000

IV. Landscape Incentives

- a. Increase incentive for turf replacement (incentive amount not yet determined).
- b. Adjust budgets for each service area according to 2016-2017 demand and projected demands.
- c. Increase Marina budget by \$11,250 to \$30,000
- d. Increase Ord budget by \$3,750 to \$10,000

Subject: Receive Updated GPCD, Water Production, and Water Consumption Data

Summary: In response to the ongoing drought, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) approved an emergency regulation that directs water purveyors to electronically report monthly water production and consumption figures. Also to be reported to the SWRCB is an estimate of the amount of water used each day by residential customers. This estimate, called "residential gallons per capita per day", or R-GPCD, more accurately portrays water use by individuals and allows communities to compare their efforts accurately with others around the state.

In support of the SWRCB actions, Marina Coast Water District staff has increased their efforts to compile and submit the required production, R-GPDC data, and other required monitoring reports each month. Staff will provide current tables and charts that show the most recent water production figures. Staff will also include tables and charts showing the gallons-per-capita-day (GPCD) and R-GPCD data that has been most currently compiled. The documents are entitled:

- 2010 2017 Total Production by Month
- Monthly Production Savings and Cumulative Savings, January 2016 Current Month
- Monthly Production Reduction Performance
- 2013 2017 Monthly GPCD (Gross Production)
- 2013 2017 Total Consumption
- 2013 2017 Residential Gallons-Per-Capita-Day
- 2017-Metered Consumption and Number of Meters
