In May, 2010, the Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) found that the Marina Coast Water District Regional Urban Water Augmentation Project Title XVI Feasibility Report submitted for review met the requirements of a complete feasibility study as defined in the Reclamation Manual Directives and Standards WTR 11-01, *Title XVI Water Reclamation and Reuse Program Feasibility Study Review Process*, and Section 1604 of Public Law 102-575, as amended.

Reclamation is collecting additional information about projects with completed Title XVI feasibility studies. To improve Reclamation's understanding of the status of the project described in the feasibility report we request that you provide responses to the following by April 28, 2017:

- 1. Please provide the status of the project described in your Title XVI feasibility study report, including the status of the planning and design work for the project, the type of environmental and cultural resources compliance planned or completed, and the status of construction activities or construction phases completed to date.
- 2. If the project has already been completed, then provide information on the year the project was completed and whether the project is currently operating.
- 3. If you do not have plans to construct the Title XVI project described in the Title XVI Feasibility Report, please let us know.
