**Agenda Title:** Adopt Resolution No. 2023-17 Rescinding Water Shortage Contingency Plan Stage 2 and Declaring Normal Water Conditions Exist

**Staff Recommendation:** Staff recommends the Board adopt Resolution No. 2023-17 rescinding Water Shortage Contingency Plan Stage 2 and declaring normal water conditions exist.

**Background:** *Strategic Plan, Goal No. 2 Infrastructure – Our objective is to provide a high quality water distribution system and an efficiently operating wastewater collection system to serve existing and future customers.*

Water Code Section 10632 required the District adopt an Urban Water Shortage Contingency Plan in response to water supply shortages. The Water Shortage Contingency Plan is a mandatory element of the District’s Urban Water Management Plan.

In August 2016, in response to drought conditions being experienced Statewide, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2016-43 declaring Water Shortage Contingency Plan Stage 2 restrictions be implemented that seeks a 10-25% Voluntary Compliance reduction in water use due to shortage. Stage 2 of the Water Shortage Contingency Plan is triggered as follows:

**STAGE 2 Triggers: >10% to 25% Water Supply Shortage**

Stage 2 conservation measures may be called for due to malfunction or failure of all or portions of the water system that reduces supplies by greater than 10% on a daily, peak seasonal or annual basis. It also may be called due to prolonged drought conditions that result in legislation, rules or ordinances enacted by the State of California and/or the County of Monterey, and/or the determination that there is a need to focus public attention on water conservation.

Further triggering could also be based on:

- 1) detection of a statistically significant increase in chloride concentrations where such concentrations may threaten to exceed the DDW “Upper Level” secondary (aesthetics) drinking water standard currently set at 500 mg/l at the well(s) in question, or
- 2) detection of a statistically significant increase in VOC concentrations, but where such concentrations do not threaten to exceed the primary drinking water MCL for each VOC at the well(s) in question and/or blending of this supply with other well supplies cannot maintain a distribution system concentration(s) below these standards.

**Discussion/Analysis:** The District has remained in Stage 2 of the Water Shortage Contingency Plan since August 2016 due to continuing and persistent drought conditions.

Thankfully, during the winter of 2022/2023, the State, and especially the Central Coast, experienced a historic winter with above normal precipitation prompting the Governor to issue Executive Order N-5-23 (attached) which rescinded various emergency orders associated with the drought and issued the following statement:

“Governor Gavin Newsom today rolled back some drought emergency provisions that are no longer needed due to current water conditions, while maintaining other measures that support regions and communities still facing water supply challenges, and that continue building up long-term water resilience. Amid climate-driven weather whiplash, the state has taken action to boost water supplies through groundwater recharge, stormwater capture, reservoir storage, and more.

Today’s action comes as the state announced [increased water deliveries](#) to 29 public water agencies that serve 27 million Californians, now expecting to deliver 75% of requested water supplies – up from 35% announced in February, and the highest since 2017.

While recent storms have helped ease drought impacts, regions and communities across the state continue to experience water supply shortages, especially communities that rely on groundwater supplies that have been severely depleted in recent years. Today’s order is responsive to current conditions while preserving smart water measures:

- Ends the voluntary 15% water conservation target, while continuing to encourage that Californians make conservation a way of life;
- Ends the requirement that local water agencies implement level 2 of their drought contingency plans;
- Maintains the ban on wasteful water uses, such as watering ornamental grass on commercial properties;
- Preserves all current emergency orders focused on groundwater supply, where the effects of the multi-year drought continue to be devastating;
- Maintains orders focused on specific watersheds that have not benefited as much from recent rains, including the Klamath River and Colorado River basins, which both remain in drought;
- Retains a state of emergency for all 58 counties to allow for drought response and recovery efforts to continue.”

Based on the Governor’s order and our local reservoir and groundwater conditions continuing improvement, staff is recommending the Board rescind Stage 2 and declare normal water conditions exist.

If the Board enacts staff’s recommendation declaring normal water conditions exist, the Board would not be abandoning Water Conservation as MCWD Ordinance 3.36.030 A-W (attached) maintains robust Water Waste restrictions even during normal water conditions.

**Environmental Review Compliance:** None required.

**Legal Counsel Review:** Legal Counsel has reviewed the resolution.

**Climate Adaptation:** Rescinding Stage 2 of the Water Shortage Contingency Plan will not have an impact on Climate Action or Adaptation as the District maintains numerous mandatory water waste restrictions via Ordinance 3.36.030 during normal water conditions.

3. Terminate water service to the site of the violation, in accordance with the district's ordinances and code and procedures for terminating water service;
4. Abate the violation as a nuisance in accordance with Section 3.32.060 of this chapter.

### **3.32.070 Nuisances, abatement and injunctive relief.**

- A. Any violation of Sections 3.32.020 and 3.32.030 is declared to be a public nuisance.
- B. The district may summarily abate the public nuisance and the district's attorney may, upon order of the board, bring civil suit or other action to enjoin or abate the nuisance.
- C. Any person who creates or maintains a public nuisance in violation of Sections 3.32.020 and 3.32.030 shall, in a civil proceeding brought to abate a nuisance or to obtain injunctive relief, be liable for the costs of abatement, including but not limited to the following:
  1. Costs of investigation;
  2. Costs of labor and parts to bring any well into compliance with sections 3.32.020 and 3.32.030;
  3. Court costs;
  4. Attorneys' fees and costs, including the fees and costs of experts employed by the attorney;
  5. Costs of monitoring compliance.
- D. If any person causes, suffers, or permits a public nuisance to continue after written notice is given to such person by the district, directing such person to cease the nuisance, and such continuation goes beyond the time set for abatement in the notice, then such person shall be liable to the district for the following:
  1. The costs of abatement set forth above;
  2. Any other costs of enforcement imposed by the court;
  3. A civil penalty of fifty percent (50%) of abatement and enforcement costs, payable to the district.

## **Chapter 3.36 WATER CONSERVATION\***

### **3.36.010 Purpose.**

The purpose of this chapter is to establish standards and procedures for water conservation, to reduce or eliminate the waste of water in the district, and enable implementation of the district's water shortage contingency plan.

(Ord. 41 § 4 (part), 2005; Ord. 40 § 4 (part), 2005)

### **3.36.020 Application.**

- A. This chapter shall apply within the district, and compliance with the provisions of this chapter shall be a condition of water service within the district and in all areas outside the district to which the district provides water service.

- B. The district shall work cooperatively with the Fort Ord Reuse Authority and other land use jurisdictions within the Ord Community service area, including the cities of Seaside, Del Rey Oaks, Marina, and Monterey; and UCMBEST; CSUMB; US Army; and the county of Monterey to facilitate the adoption of ordinances and regulations to conserve water, including inspection of installations made pursuant to this chapter.
- C. All references to standard specifications contained in this chapter shall refer to the latest versions of the district Standard Plans and Specifications for Construction of Domestic Water, Sewer, and Recycled Water Facilities and Procedures, Guidelines and Design Requirements.

(Ord. 41 § 4 (part), 2005; Ord. 40 § 4 (part), 2005)

### **3.36.030 Mandatory restrictions on water waste.**

- A. Repair of Plumbing, Sprinkler and Irrigation System. Any owner, manager, or person responsible for the day-to-day operation of any premises shall within seventy-two hours after such person first learns of such leaks, breaks, or defects, initiate steps to repair any leaking, broken or defective water pipes, faucets, plumbing fixtures, other water service appliances, sprinklers, watering or irrigation systems, or distribution systems which cause or may cause water waste and shall thereafter diligently and promptly pursue such repair work to completion, unless a variance is obtained from the district.
- B. Watering/Irrigation.
  - 1. No person shall water grass, lawns, groundcover, shrubbery, and open ground between the hours of ten a.m. and five p.m. except as provided below:
    - a. Persons may water between the hours of ten a.m. and five p.m. using any of the following three methods:
      - i. Drip irrigation;
      - ii. By hand, using a bucket; and/or
      - iii. By hand, using a hose with an automatic shutoff nozzle.
    - b. The general manager may grant an administrative variance for methods other than those included in subsection (B)(1)(a) of this section if:
      - i. The person requesting the variance is now using, or will use as a condition to the granting of the variance, water-conserving irrigation practices approved by the general manager that minimize water evaporation losses, and that assure that no substantial amount of water is permitted to run off the area of application. Recycled water use shall be in accordance with Chapter 4.28, Recycled Water, of this code.
      - ii. As a condition of granting a variance, the general manager may require the water user to post, at locations conspicuous to view, notices of the variance.
    - c. In lieu of granting a variance, the general manager may, at his/her discretion, refer a variance request directly to the board for its decision.
  - 2. No person shall allow grass, lawns, groundcover, shrubbery, and open ground to be watered at any time while it is raining.
  - 3. No person shall use, suffer, or permit the use of water for agricultural irrigation in a manner or to an extent which substantially conflicts with or deviates from best management practices in the county of Monterey or which allows water to run to waste.

- C. Washing of Vehicles. No person shall use a water hose to wash any car, truck, boat, trailer, bus, recreational vehicle, camper, aircraft, tractor, or any other vehicle, or any portion thereof, unless the hose is equipped with an automatic shutoff nozzle.
- D. Cleaning of Structures. No person shall use water through a hose to clean the exterior of any building or structure unless such hose is equipped with a shutoff nozzle.
- E. Cleaning of Surfaces. No person shall use water through a hose to clean any sidewalk, driveway, roadway, parking lot, or any other outdoor paved or hard surfaced area, except where necessary to protect public health or safety. The use of water from a bucket for cleaning food, grease, oil, or other stains or spillage from surfaces is permissible.
- F. Water Spillage. No person shall cause, suffer, or permit water to spill into streets, curbs, or gutters. No person shall use any water in any manner that results in runoff beyond the immediate area of use. Every person is deemed to have under his/her control at all times his/her water distribution lines and facilities, and to know the manner and extent of his/her water use and excess runoff.
- G. Swimming Pools and Spas. No person shall empty and refill a swimming pool or spa except to prevent or repair structural damage or to comply with public health regulations. All pools and spas shall be covered to prevent evaporative losses when not in use.
- H. Fountains. No person shall use water to operate or maintain levels in decorative fountains, unless such water is recirculated in the fountain.
- I. Visitor-Serving Facilities. The owner and manager of each hotel, motel, restaurant, convention and other visitor-serving facility shall ensure that such facility displays, in places visible to all customers, placards or decals approved by the district, promoting public awareness of the need for water conservation and/or advising the public that waste of water is prohibited.
- J. Public and Quasi-Public Entities. All public and quasi-public entities shall display, in visible locations in all restrooms, kitchens, and dining areas, placards or decals approved by the district, promoting public awareness of the need for water conservation and/or advising the public that waste of water is prohibited. Placement of placards or decals by a quasi-public entity of a type not specifically mentioned in this chapter shall not be required unless the general manager gives written notice to the entity that this chapter is applicable to the entity so notified and that placement of placards or decals is required.
- K. Restaurants. Restaurants in the district shall not serve water to restaurant customers, except upon request of the customer.
- L. Commercial Car Washes. No person in charge of the operation of any commercial car wash facility shall suffer or permit the washing of any boat or vehicle in such facility or on its premises, other than by the following methods:
  - 1. Use of mechanical automatic car wash facilities utilizing water-recycling equipment;
  - 2. Use of a hose that operates on a timer for limited time periods and shuts off automatically at the expiration of the time period;
  - 3. Use of a hose equipped with an automatic shutoff nozzle; and/or
  - 4. Use of bucket and hand washing.
- M. Construction.

1. No potable water may be used for compacting or dust control purposes in construction activities where there is a reasonably available source of recycled or other nonpotable water approved by the California State Department of Health Services and appropriate for such use.
  2. All water hoses used in connection with any construction activities shall be equipped with an automatic shutoff nozzle when an automatic shutoff nozzle can be purchased or otherwise obtained for the size or type of hose in use.
- N. Use of Hydrants. No person may tap into any fire hydrant for any purpose other than fire suppression or emergency aid, without first obtaining written approval from the district engineer or his/her designee.
- O. Agricultural Dust Control. No potable water may be used for dust control purposes in agricultural activities where there is a reasonably available source of recycled or other nonpotable water appropriate for such use. Recycled water use shall be in accordance with Chapter 4.28, Recycled Water, of this code.
- P. Maintenance/Training. No person shall use water for routine water system flushing for normal maintenance, routine sewer system flushing for normal maintenance, and/or fire personnel training except as approved in advance in writing by the general manager, district engineer, or his/her designee.
- Q. Indiscriminate Use. No person shall cause, suffer, or permit the indiscriminate running of water not otherwise prohibited above which is wasteful and without reasonable purpose.
- R. Public Health and Safety. These regulations shall not be construed to limit water use which is immediately necessary to protect public health or safety.
- S. New Construction.
1. In all new construction, the following applies:
    - a. Only high efficiency toilets (HET) that meet the district's standard specifications shall be installed. Dual flush toilets qualify as HET.
    - b. There shall be one control valve, or one set of hot and cold valves required for each low flow showerhead which shall be defined to provide not more than 2.5 gallons per minute.
    - c. A hot water recirculation system or point-of-use hot water heater shall supply water to hot water fixtures further than ten linear feet of pipe away from the hot water heater.
    - d. All urinals installed will be zero water use urinals, in that they shall not use water to flush waste.
    - e. All residential units equipped with clothes washer connections shall have installed high efficiency (HE) clothes washer(s) meeting district's standard specifications.
  2. All new construction shall conform with district's standard specifications for landscaping and irrigation systems and the requirements of the state of California Model Landscape Ordinance, Title 23, Division 2, California Code of Regulations Chapter 2.7 or applicable local ordinances superseding the state ordinance.
- T. New Additions, Renovations, or Remodels. This subsection includes, but is not limited to, projects in which the replacement or addition of plumbing fixtures is included.
1. All new additions, renovations, or remodels that involve any plumbing fixture additions and require district review and approval must install:
    - a. Ultra low flow toilets (ULFT), high efficiency toilets (HET), or zero water use urinals (in place of water use urinals);
    - b. Low flow showerheads with a maximum flow capacity of 2.5 gallons per minute; and

- c. New additions, renovations, or remodels must also include the retrofitting of all existing toilets and showerheads with low flow showerheads, ULFT's or HET's.
  2. All renovations/remodels that do not require plan checks by the district, but do involve a change in a toilet must replace at least that toilet with an ULFT or an HET. All renovations/remodels that do not require plan checks by the district, but do involve the change of a showerhead must replace at least that showerhead with a low flow showerhead.
- U. Retrofitting Existing Hotels/Motels and Apartment Buildings. All existing hotels/motels, and apartment buildings shall, within six and twelve months, respectively, following the effective date of the ordinance codified in this chapter, be retrofitted with low flow showerheads.
- V. Retrofitting Upon Change of Ownership or Use.
  1. All existing residential structures shall, at the time of ownership change, be retrofitted, if not already so, with HET's or ULFT's with a maximum tank size, flush volume, or flush system volume of 1.6 gallons per flush. Low flow showerheads with a maximum flow capacity of 2.5 gallons per minute shall be installed.
  2. All existing commercial and industrial structures shall, at the time of ownership change or change of use, be retrofitted, if not already so, with HET's or ULFT's with a maximum tank size, flush volume, or flush system of 1.6 gallons per flush. Low flow showerheads with a maximum flow capacity of 2.5 gallons per minute shall be installed. High efficiency clothes washing machines using a maximum of 8.5 gallons of water per cubic foot of laundry shall also be installed. All urinals will be retrofitted to zero water use urinals.
- W. Metering.
  1. All water use shall be metered unless it is used by authorized persons for public health and safety issues or if that use is otherwise recognized by the district.
  2. New Construction.
    - a. Newly constructed multifamily dwelling units, including condominiums, and detached dwelling units will be metered individually as of the effective date of the ordinance codified in this chapter.
    - b. Newly constructed motel/hotel units of less than one thousand square feet will be exempt from the requirement to individually meter.
    - c. Newly constructed hotel/motel units greater than or equal to one thousand square feet shall be separately metered.
    - d. Newly constructed time-share units will be separately metered.
  3. Conversion of Existing Structures. The following existing units shall be individually metered upon conversion:
    - a. Multifamily units converted into condominiums or time-share units;
    - b. Motel/hotel units converted into multifamily units, time-share units or condominiums;
    - c. Time-share units converted into multifamily units, condominiums or motel/hotel units;
    - d. Condominium units converted into multifamily units, time-share units or motel/hotel units;
    - e. Detached garages or other nondwelling structures converted into dwelling units.

4. Other Multifamily Water Uses. All other uses within multifamily dwelling complexes, such as irrigation systems and laundry rooms, shall be metered separately, subject to the approval of the district engineer or his/her designee.
5. Meter Location. Meters shall be located at the property boundary or the public utility easement. Exact meter locations are subject to district engineer approval or his/her designee.
6. Meter Type and Size. The district shall approve the size and type of meters required. The owner shall pay for the meters and construct their connections in accordance with the district's standard specifications.

### **3.36.035 Water shortage contingency plan.**

The district maintains a water shortage contingency plan in conformance with the Water Code Section 10632. Provisions of that plan will be enforced through this chapter.

(Ord. 41 § 4 (part), 2005; Ord. 40 § 4 (part), 2005)

### **3.36.040 Enforcement and administration.**

The general manager and all officers and employees of the district, including all ex officio officers and employees, shall enforce all the provisions of this chapter. The general manager shall implement and administer this chapter. The general manager shall report to the board of directors all factors which affect the implementation of this chapter and shall maintain a separate file of violations of this chapter and a file of any requests for variances from this chapter.

(Ord. 41 § 4 (part), 2005; Ord. 40 § 4 (part), 2005)

### **3.36.050 Violations and notices.**

- A. If any person fails or refuses to comply with this chapter, the general manager or his/her agent shall provide that person with written notice of the violation and an opportunity to correct the noncompliance. The written notice shall:
  1. Be posted or presented at the site of the noncompliance;
  2. State the time, date, and place of violation;
  3. State a general description of the violation;
  4. State the means to correct the violation;
  5. State a date by which correction is required;
  6. State the possible consequences of failing to correct the violation; and
  7. A copy of the written notice shall be mailed to the address of the violation, to the party who is billed for the water, or to the owner of the property, as appropriate.
- B. Each person who receives a written notice of violation shall pay to the district an administrative fee of one hundred dollars for the first notice, two hundred dollars for the second notice, and five hundred dollars for each additional violation within one year. To encourage cooperative water conservation, the general manager may waive payment of the fee for the first or second notice.

- C. If a person fails to correct the violation within the time specified in the written notice, the general manager shall take one or more of the following actions:
1. Give the person one or more additional written notices of the violation;
  2. Refuse to initiate water service to the site of the violation, if water service has not yet begun or has been discontinued;
  3. Terminate water service to the site of the violation, in accordance with the district's ordinances and procedures for terminating water service;
  4. Abate the violation as a nuisance in accordance with Section 3.36.060 of this chapter;
  5. Impose a use fee of four times the regular water rate for each unit (hcf) of water that the district estimates is wasted.

**3.36.060 Nuisances, abatement, injunctive relief.**

- A. Any violation of this chapter is declared to be a public nuisance.
- B. The district may summarily abate the public nuisance and the district's attorney may, upon order of the board of directors, bring civil suit or other action to enjoin or abate the nuisance.
- C. In a civil proceeding brought to abate a nuisance or to obtain injunctive relief under this chapter, any person who creates or maintains a public nuisance in violation of this chapter shall be liable for the costs of abatement, including but not limited to the following:
1. Costs of investigation;
  2. Costs of labor and parts to repair any affected water system or premises, to bring such water system or premises into compliance with this chapter, or to install facilities necessary to assure compliance with this chapter;
  3. Court costs;
  4. Attorneys' fees and costs, including the fees and costs of experts employed by the attorney; and
  5. Costs of monitoring compliance.
- D. If any person causes, suffers, or permits a public nuisance to continue after written notice is given to such person by the district directing such person to cease the nuisance, and such continuation goes beyond the time set for abatement in the notice, then such person shall be liable to the district for the following:
1. The costs of abatement set forth above;
  2. Any other costs of enforcement imposed by the court; and
  3. A civil penalty of fifty percent (50%) of those costs (subsections (D)(1) and (D)(2) of this section), payable to the district.
- E. This does not preclude the district from taking action against individuals for unauthorized taking of water under Penal Code Section 498.

**EXECUTIVE ORDER N-5-23**

**WHEREAS** on April 21, 2021, May 10, 2021, July 8, 2021, and October 19, 2021, I proclaimed States of Emergency to exist due to drought conditions; and

**WHEREAS** the multi-year nature of the current drought, which began three years after the record-setting drought of 2012-2016, continues to have significant, immediate impacts on communities across California with vulnerable water supplies, farms that rely on irrigation to grow food and fiber, and fish and wildlife that rely on stream flows and cool water; and

**WHEREAS** the March 3, 2023, snow survey conducted by the Department of Water Resources and partner agencies found that most regions of the Sierra Nevada are above average for snow water content, and some regions are nearing record amounts of snow, and snow and rain has fallen across many regions of the state since then, with more precipitation forecasted; and

**WHEREAS** improved conditions have helped rehabilitate surface water supplies, but have not abated the severe drought conditions that remain in some parts of the State, including the Klamath River basin and the Colorado River basin, and many groundwater basins throughout the State remain depleted from overreliance and successive multi-year droughts; and

**WHEREAS** continued action by the State is needed to address ongoing consequences of the drought emergency, including groundwater supply shortages, domestic well failures, and drought-related harm to native fishes in the Klamath River and Clear Lake watersheds; and

**WHEREAS** the drought emergency has required a dynamic and flexible response from the State, and several provisions in my prior Proclamations and Orders have been terminated or superseded already, specifically Paragraphs 4 and 8 of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated April 21, 2021, Paragraphs 2, 4, and 7 of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated May 10, 2021, Paragraphs 3, 4, 5, 6, and 10 of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated July 8, 2021, and Paragraph 9 of Executive Order N-7-22; and

**WHEREAS** improved conditions warrant an even more targeted State response to the ongoing drought emergency and certain provisions in my State of Emergency Proclamations dated April 21, 2021, May 10, 2021, July 8, 2021, and October 19, 2021, and in Executive Orders N-10-21, N-7-22, and N-3-23 provide authority that is no longer needed to mitigate the effects of the drought conditions or direct actions by state agencies, departments, and boards that have already been completed; and

**WHEREAS** notwithstanding the rescission of certain emergency authorities for emergency drinking water action, state agencies have existing legal authority and funding to continue expedited work to advance the human right to water, and state agencies will continue all ongoing drought resilience planning work, including through coordination with local agencies and tribes; and



**WHEREAS** next winter's hydrology is uncertain and the most efficient way to preserve the State's improved surface water supplies is for Californians to continue their ongoing efforts to make conservation a way of life; and

**WHEREAS** to protect public health and safety, it is critical the State take certain immediate actions without undue delay to prepare for and mitigate the effects of the drought conditions, and under Government Code section 8571, I find that strict compliance with various statutes and regulations specified in this Order would prevent, hinder, or delay the mitigation of the effects of the drought conditions.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, GAVIN NEWSOM**, Governor of the State of California, in accordance with the authority vested in me by the State Constitution and statutes, including the California Emergency Services Act, and in particular, Government Code sections 8567, 8571, and 8627, do hereby issue the following Order to become effective immediately:

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

1. The orders and provisions contained in my State of Emergency Proclamations dated April 21, 2021, May 10, 2021, July 8, 2021, and October 19, 2021, and Executive Orders N-7-22 (March 28, 2022), N-3-23 (February 13, 2023), and N-4-23 (March 10, 2023), remain in full force and effect, except as modified by those Proclamations and Orders and herein. State agencies shall continue to implement all directions from those Proclamations and Orders and accelerate implementation where feasible.
2. The following provisions of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated April 21, 2021, are terminated:
  - a. Paragraph 2;
  - b. Paragraphs 5-7; and
  - c. Paragraphs 9-14.
3. The following provisions of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated May 10, 2021, are terminated:
  - a. Paragraph 1;
  - b. Paragraph 3;
  - c. Paragraph 5; and
  - d. Paragraphs 9-10.
4. The following provisions of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated July 8, 2021, are terminated:
  - a. Paragraph 2;
  - b. Paragraphs 7-8, except those portions of paragraph 7 withdrawing provisions of prior orders;
  - c. Paragraphs 11-12.

5. The following provisions of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated October 19, 2021, are terminated:

- a. Paragraph 2;
- b. Paragraphs 4-5;
- c. Paragraph 8; and
- d. Paragraph 10.

6. The following provisions of Executive Order N-10-21 are terminated:

- a. Paragraph 1; and
- b. Paragraph 3

7. The following provisions of Executive Order N-7-22 are terminated:

- a. Paragraphs 1-3;
- b. Paragraph 6; and
- c. Paragraphs 14-15.

8. The following provisions of Executive Order N-3-23 are terminated:

- a. Paragraph 1; and
- b. Paragraph 3, except those portions of the paragraph withdrawing provisions of prior orders.


9. Paragraph 6 of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated May 10, 2021, and Paragraph 9 of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated July 8, 2021, are withdrawn and replaced with the following text:

To ensure critical instream flows for species protection in the Klamath River and Clear Lake watersheds, the State Water Resources Control Board (Water Board) and Department of Fish and Wildlife shall evaluate the minimum instream flows and other actions needed to protect salmon, steelhead, the Clear Lake Hitch, and other native fishes in critical streams systems in these watersheds and work with water users, tribes, and other parties on voluntary measures to implement those actions. To the extent voluntary actions are not sufficient, the Water Board, in coordination with the Department of Fish and Wildlife, shall consider emergency regulations to establish minimum instream flows to mitigate the effects of the drought conditions. For purposes of state agencies carrying out or approving any actions contemplated by this paragraph, Public Resources Code, Division 13 (commencing with Section 21000) and regulations adopted pursuant to that Division are suspended. Nothing in this Paragraph affects or limits the validity of actions already taken in the Klamath and Clear Lake watersheds or ongoing under Paragraph 6 of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated May 10, 2021, or Paragraph 9 of my State of Emergency Proclamation dated July 8, 2021.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that as soon as hereafter possible, this Order be filed in the Office of the Secretary of State and that widespread publicity and notice be given of this Order.

This Order is not intended to, and does not, create any rights or benefits, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or in equity, against the State of California, its agencies, departments, entities, officers, employees, or any other person.

**Agenda Title:** Adopt Resolution No. 2023-18 to Award a Sole Source Contract to Calcon Systems for Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition and Motor Control Center On-Call services.

**Staff Recommendation:** The Board of Directors to award a sole source contract to Calcon Systems for Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) and Motor Control Center (MCC) on-call services and authorize the General Manager or their designee to execute the contracts and all necessary documents.

**Background:** *Strategic Plan Mission Statement – We provide our customers with high quality water, wastewater collection and conservation services at a reasonable cost, through planning, management and the development of water resources in an environmentally sensitive manner.*

Marina Coast Water District (District) operates and maintains the water (CA 2710017), the wastewater (3SSO 10287), and the recycled water systems (3 270720819) for Central Marina and the Ord Community. The District operates and maintains 7 active drinking water wells, 5 water booster pump stations, 8 potable storage reservoirs, 1 recycled water storage reservoir, and 20 sewer lift stations. Comprised within these stations are a total of: 35 motor control centers (MCC's), 32 level transducers, 43 floats, 47 radios, 40 Programmable Logic Controllers (PLC's), 2 Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) systems, 2 SCADA auto dialer systems, and 1 Historian SCADA Server.

**Discussion/Analysis:** The District's water and sewer systems are very complex and rely on many different electrical components to communicate with each other and to the centralized SCADA system. This work is specialized and requires the use of a system integrator. The District's current integrator for the last five years has been Calcon Systems. They have been extremely reliable and helped the District transform its SCADA and pump stations into a robust, reliable system. Calcon Systems has extensive knowledge of the District's programs, layout, and design and can quickly respond, troubleshoot, and repair issues as they arise. Due to the heightened security concerns around water and sewer infrastructure, it is best practice to limit the amount of exposure to the SCADA systems as much as possible from outside vendors or contractors and to utilize someone with the technological expertise and knowledge of security measures to safeguard these systems. Calcon Systems has a District integrator who has undergone extensive cybersecurity training on water and wastewater SCADA systems and has utilized protective measures to incorporate those safeguards into the District's systems.

Another critical component is the MCC's which house all the electronics, instrumentation, and control wiring to start and stop the District large pumping equipment. Failure on any of these components is critical and time-sensitive, and additional on-call coverage will help safeguard the District's pump stations. Calcon Systems has performed work on the District's MCC in the past, and they have a great understanding of the District's MCC's and components and can make the necessary repairs if needed.

Calcon Systems works very well with the operations staff, and they will respond 24 hours a day, seven days a week, if needed. They have, on several occasions, helped the District throughout the night make technical repairs to prevent major failures in our water and sewer systems.

Calcon Systems' current five-year contract ends May 30, 2023. Therefore, staff is recommending that the Board of Directors award a sole-sourced three-year, fixed-priced contract to Calcons Systems, with the option to extend two additional one-year terms.

**Environmental Review Compliance:** None required.

**Legal Counsel Review:** Legal Counsel has reviewed the template sent out to Calcon Systems.

**Climate Adaptation:** SCADA can be used to track power consumption, make adjustments to pump stations, and see real-time failures on the District's infrastructure, allowing for a rapid response and a reduction in power consumption.

**Financial Impact:**  Yes  No Funding Source/Recap: Funding for SCADA and MCC work will come from each cost center's budgeted Maintenance and Equipment fund for each pump station and the Telemetry fund for each cost center.

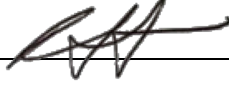

**Agenda Title:** Adopt Resolution No. 2023-19 to Award a Contract to the Don Chapin Company, Inc., and Monterey Peninsula Engineering for On-Call Construction Services.

**Staff Recommendation:** The Board of Directors to award the contract to the Don Chapin Company, Inc., and Monterey Peninsula Engineering for on-call construction services and authorize the General Manager or their designee to execute the contracts and all necessary documents.

**Background:** *Strategic Plan Mission Statement – We provide our customers with high quality water, wastewater collection and conservation services at a reasonable cost, through planning, management and the development of water resources in an environmentally sensitive manner.*

Marina Coast Water District (District) operates and maintains the water (CA 2710017), the wastewater (3SSO 10287), and the recycled water systems (3 270720819) for Central Marina and the Ord Community. The District's Operations and Maintenance Department (O & M) maintains approximately 230 miles of potable and recycled water distribution pipe ranging in size from 2" through 24". Distribution pipeline material is comprised of: PVC plastic, steel, ductile iron, and asbestos cement. The District also maintains approximately 155 miles of sewer gravity mains ranging in size from 4" to 30" and approximately 6.4 miles of force mains ranging in size from 4" to 12". The sewer system pipeline is comprised of: PVC plastic, steel, ductile iron, asbestos cement, and vitrified clay pipe.

**Discussion/Analysis:** The District's water and sewer systems are complex, with a vast network of pipes and often an unconventional layout. Typically, O & M performs all repairs on pipelines in-house. However, situations arise where O & M cannot perform repairs, such as in the case of a large-diameter pipeline or one that is very deep, as this requires large equipment not owned by the District. Since these repairs are infrequent, it does not make financial sense to purchase large equipment and pipe to do these repairs in-house. Also, should there be a catastrophic failure such as a natural disaster, having an on-call contractor is critical to respond rapidly and in order to assist the District in mitigating the issues.

Currently, the Don Chapin Company is the contractor on the list for on-call services for the District, and their contract is set to expire on May 30, 2023. Therefore, a request for qualifications (RFQ) was sent to six nearby capable contractors for on-call construction work that can meet the response requirements and perform the complex work. The six contractors the RFQ was sent to were: Don Chapin Company, Inc., Monterey Peninsula Engineering (MPE), Granite Construction, Sanco Pipelines, James Sommerville Inc., and West Valley Construction. The closing date for the RFQ was May 1, 2023, and the District received two (2) RFQ responses, one from the Don Chapin Company, Inc and the other from Monterey Peninsula Engineering. Both contractors have done reputable work for the District and are ready and capable of making a rapid response should there be an immediate need for assistance.

The RFQ requires firm pricing for a three-year period, and then two additional one-year extensions can be granted for a total of a five-year period.

Staff is recommending the Board of Directors approve and award the three-year contracts to the Don Chapin Company, Inc. and Monterey Peninsula Engineering for on-call construction work with the possibility of two additional one-year extensions.

**Environmental Review Compliance:** None required.

**Legal Counsel Review:** Legal Counsel has reviewed the RFQ template sent out to the list of contractors.

**Climate Adaptation:** Having an on-call construction contractor will allow the District to rapidly respond to emergencies and mitigate any spill or wasted water, thus reducing power consumption and additional greenhouse gas emissions.

**Financial Impact:**  Yes  No Funding Source/Recap: Funding for emergency pipeline work would come from the \$340,000.00 budgeted emergency repairs should it be needed. Any general work would come from the budgeted Operations and Maintenance or the Maintenance and Equipment fund for each pump station per the appropriated cost center.

**DESCRIPTION:** Request for Qualification for Marina Coast Water District's (MCWD, or District) water, sewer, and recycled water repairs and related services agreement. Installation and repair work shall consist of all water, sewer, and recycled pipelines and appurtenances within the District's service area. A four (4) hour response time to the District's boundaries is required if called upon in an emergency.

**BACKGROUND:** The District operates and maintains the water, sewer and recycled water for Central Marina, and portions of Fort Ord, County of Monterey, City of Seaside, CSU Monterey Bay, and the US Military housing. The systems are comprised of 8 drinking water wells, 5 water pump stations, 9 storage reservoirs and 20 sewer lift stations. The District maintains approximately 215 miles of water pipe ranging in sizes from 4"-24" and approximately 155 miles sewer pipe ranging in size from 4"-30."

**ESTIMATED USAGE:** If approved, MCWD neither implies nor guarantees a specific level of usage, if any, as a result of that approval.

**PRICING AND CONTRACT TERM:** All prices shall remain firm for the entire initial agreement period. Awarded contractor(s) are responsible for ensuring compliance with all Federal, State and local laws and follow the Marina Coast Water District's "Injury and Illness Prevention Program". Copies of the program are available upon request. Contractor(s) must comply with the Department of Industrial Relations Contractor Registration requirements and certify such compliance by completing and submitting the attached Certification. If the supplier intends to be available to work inside pipelines or other confined spaces, he must have a confined-space training program in place and provide a written copy of the program with this request. The program must be in compliance with the California Code of Regulations, Title 8, and Section 5156-58 of the General Industry Safety Orders.

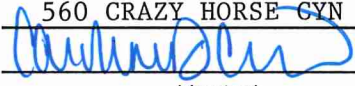

**GENERAL PROVISIONS  
(February 2023 Edition)**

**WORKER'S COMPENSATION AND PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE**

a. Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance

(1) The awarded contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of the contract, Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance for all of its employees on the project and shall comply with Labor Code Section 3700. In lieu of evidence of Worker's Compensation Insurance, the District will accept a Self-Insuring Certificate from the State of California.

(2) The following certification, required by Labor Code Section 1861, is incorporated by reference into this contract:

"I am aware of the provision of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract."

By signing the contract with the District, the awarded contractor is signing and filing the above certification with the District.

(3) The awarded contractor shall require all subcontractors to provide the Contractor with evidence of Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance, all in strict compliance with California State Law.

b. Public Liability Insurance

(1) The awarded contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of the contract Comprehensive Automobile Insurance and General Liability Insurance that provide protection for claims which may arise out of or result from operations or performance under the contract, whether such operations or performance be by the Contractor or by any subcontractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable.

(iii) The policy covers Blanket Contractual Liability;

(iv) The policy limits of liability are provided on an Occurrence basis;

(v) The policy covers Broad Form Property Damage Liability;

- (vi) The policy covers Personal Injury as well as Bodily Injury Liability including coverage for personal injury claims against any insured by employees of any other insured;
- (vii) The policy covers Products and Completed Operations for a period of not less than three (3) years following final completion or termination of this contract.
- (viii) The policy covers use of Non-owned Autos;
- (ix) The coverage shall not be canceled nor materially altered unless 30 days written notice is given to the District;
- (x) "Cross Liability" or "Severability of Interest" clause.
- (xi) An insurer's waiver of subrogation in favor of all insured and additionally insured under the policies of insurance provided.

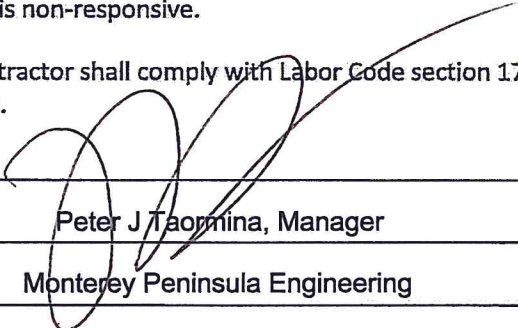

**DESCRIPTION:** Request for Qualification for Marina Coast Water District's (MCWD, or District) water, sewer, and recycled water repairs and related services agreement. Installation and repair work shall consist of all water, sewer, and recycled pipelines and appurtenances within the District's service area. A four (4) hour response time to the District's boundaries is required if called upon in an emergency.

**BACKGROUND:** The District operates and maintains the water, sewer and recycled water for Central Marina, and portions of Fort Ord, County of Monterey, City of Seaside, CSU Monterey Bay, and the US Military housing. The systems are comprised of 8 drinking water wells, 5 water pump stations, 9 storage reservoirs and 20 sewer lift stations. The District maintains approximately 215 miles of water pipe ranging in sizes from 4"-24" and approximately 155 miles sewer pipe ranging in size from 4"-30."

**WORKER'S COMPENSATION AND PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE**

a. Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance

(1) The awarded contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of the contract, Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance for all of its employees on the project and shall comply with Labor Code Section 3700. In lieu of evidence of Worker's Compensation Insurance, the District will accept a Self-Insuring Certificate from the State of California.

(2) The following certification, required by Labor Code Section 1861, is incorporated by reference into this contract:

"I am aware of the provision of Section 3700 of the Labor Code which require every employer to be insured against liability for workers' compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this contract."

By signing the contract with the District, the awarded contractor is signing and filing the above certification with the District.

(3) The awarded contractor shall require all subcontractors to provide the Contractor with evidence of Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance, all in strict compliance with California State Law.

b. Public Liability Insurance

- (ix) The coverage shall not be canceled nor materially altered unless 30 days written notice is given to the District;

**Agenda Title:** Receive the First Quarter Investment Report for Calendar Year 2023

**Staff Recommendation:** The Board receives the Marina Coast Water District Quarterly Investment Report for 2023.

**Background:** *Strategic Plan, Goal No. 4 – To manage the District’s finances in the most effective and fiscally responsible manner.*

The California Government Code Section 53646 and the District’s Investment Policy requires that a Quarterly Investment Report be submitted to the Board for review. This investment report allows the Board and the public to verify that the District’s funds are invested in a safe and prudent manner, and that such investments comply with the District’s Investment Policy and State Law.

**Discussion/Analysis:** The District’s combined portfolio as of March 31, 2023 has a book value of \$29,715,946. 34% of which is invested with the State’s Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) earning an interest of 2.74%. The remaining 66% is invested in various investment vehicles with Mechanics Bank with interest rates ranging from 3.50% to 3.56%. Currently, there is \$14.3M sitting on our Restricted Money Market Accounts, a portion thereof has already been invested in additional CD’s with other bank institutions as of April 2023. These additional investments will be reflected on the next Quarterly Investment Report.

Overall, the District’s investments continue to perform well as can be seen with the historical summary provided.

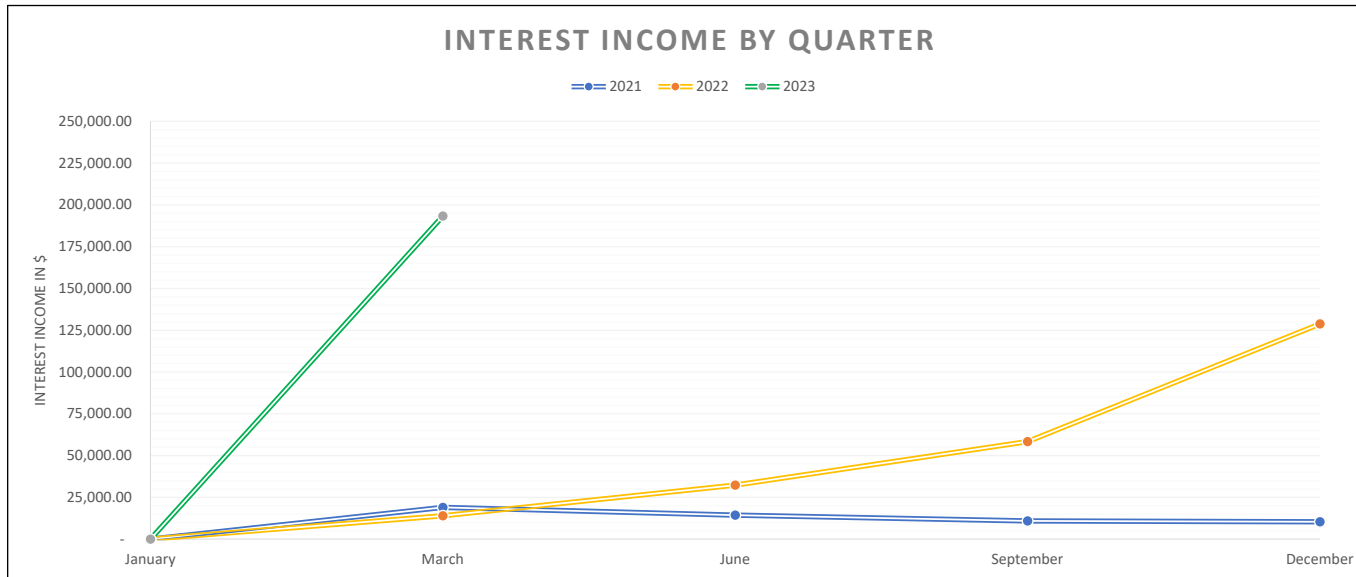
