Agenda Title: Consider Adoption of Resolution No. 2010-08 to Approve an Agreement between

Marina Coast Water District and the Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency for Use of the Regional Treatment Plant's Outfall for Brine Disposal

Detailed Description: The Board of Directors is requested to review and approve an Agreement between Marina Coast Water District (District) and the Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency (MRWPCA) for use of the regional wastewater treatment plant's outfall for brine disposal (hereafter "Outfall Agreement").

This Agreement implements the April 15, 2009 MOU and provides mutually beneficial terms and conditions and adequate consideration for planning, designing, permitting, financing, operation and maintenance, scheduling, quality requirements, term, priorities, and fair compensation to MRWPCA for District's connection to and use of the Outfall to discharge desalination brine into the ocean.

The agreement sets forth the responsibilities of the District and MRWPCA to plan, design, conduct environmental review, obtain and issue permits, and maintain the Connection and Brine Receiving Facilities as defined in the Outfall Agreement. The Parties intend to conduct their activities under this Agreement in accordance with the certified Final Environmental Impact Report for the Coastal Water Project (FEIR) and subsequent, discretionary approvals by appropriate agencies for a project to discharge an amount and strength of saline water (brine) not exceeding that analyzed in the FEIR. District Counsel advises that this Agreement is not, in and of itself, a project under CEQA.

The General Manager, as designated negotiator for the District, recommends approval of the Agreement by the Board.

The Agreement was negotiated in collaboration with MRWPCA. The Agreement has been reviewed by District Legal Counsel and approved as to form for execution by the District.

Environmental Review Compliance: None required.

Resolution No. 2010-08 Resolution of the Board of Directors Marina Coast Water District Approving the Outfall Agreement with the Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency

January 20, 2010

RESOLVED by the Board of Directors ("Directors") of the Marina Coast Water District ("the District"), at a special meeting duly called and held on January 20, 2010, at the business office of the District, 11 Reservation Road, Marina, California as follows:

WHEREAS, the District and the Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency ("MRWPCA") desired to establish mutually beneficial terms and conditions and adequate consideration for planning, designing, permitting, financing, operation and maintenance, scheduling, quality requirements, term, priorities, and fair compensation to MRWPCA for the District's connection to and use of the MRWPCA's regional treatment plant outfall to transport desalination brine for ocean discharge; and,

WHEREAS, on April 15, 2009, the District and the MRWPCA signed a Memorandum of Understanding for investigating and analyzing the use of the Regional Treatment Plant's outfall for brine disposal; and,

WHEREAS, on June 16, 2009, the District and the MRWPCA signed a Memorandum of Understanding for the Regional Urban Water Augmentation Project ("RUWAP MOU") that includes provision for the District and MRWPCA to meet and confer in good faith to evaluated the feasibility of using the Regional Treatment Plant's outfall for transport and discharge of brine byproduct from a water desalination facility; and,

WHEREAS, the District and the MRWPCA have negotiated draft terms and conditions for use of the MRPWCA' regional plant outfall to transport pre-treated desalination brine for ocean discharge as shown in the attached "Outfall Agreement"; and,

WHEREAS, the Outfall Agreement does not commit the District or MRWPCA to any activities that may result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect change to the physical environment prior to project approval by appropriate agencies, including adoption of all required California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") findings, approval of Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program or Plan, and compliance with other requirements of CEQA; and,

WHEREAS, because the Outfall Agreement involves establishment, structuring, and approval of charges by public agencies for the purpose of meeting operating expenses and obtaining funds for capital projects, the District's Legal Counsel advises that the approval of the Outfall Agreement is statutorily exempt from the CEQA as defined by Sections 21080(b)(8)(A) and 21080(b)(8)(D) of the California Public Resources Code; and,

WHEREAS, the District's General Manager as the District's designated negotiator recommends that the Board approve the Agreement for execution in the form presented to the Board in open session on January 20, 2010.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Marina Coast Water District does hereby approve the Outfall Agreement with the Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency and authorizes execution of the Agreement by the District's Board President and Secretary.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the General Manager is authorized and directed to prepare and file an appropriate Notice of Exemption for the approval of the Outfall Agreement, based on the finding that approval of the Outfall Agreement is statutorily exempt from CEQA as defined by Sections 21080(b)(8)(D) and 21080(b)(8)(A) of the Public Resources Code.
