Transfer of Water, Sewer, and Recycled Water Infrastructure Agreement between Marina Coast Water District and University Village Associates for the University Village Apartment Project within the Dunes on Monterey Bay Development

Detailed Description: The Board of Directors is requested to approve a Construction and Transfer of Water, Sewer, and Recycled Water Infrastructure Agreement (hereafter referred to as an Infrastructure Agreement) between MCWD and University Village Associates (a Limited Partnership) for the University Village Apartment project within the Dunes on Monterey Bay development. South County Housing is the primary partner in the University Village Associates limited partnership and has worked with MCWD on several project-related topics in the past.

The University Village Apartments development consists of the new construction of an apartment complex on a roughly 4.5-acre parcel within the Dunes on Monterey Bay master development on lands of the former Fort Ord. A total of ten buildings are proposed within the project which will contain 108-apartment dwelling units of various sizes (1, 2, and 3-bedroom units), common area interior spaces, and laundry facilities. Approximately 35,000-SF (less than 1-acre) of irrigated landscaping is proposed. Related infrastructure to be installed and owned by MCWD includes a potable water pipeline loop around the perimeter of the entire parcel with a pipeline branch (within an easement) traversing through the parcel and connecting each side of the potable water pipe loop such that two distinct pipeline loops are created. The eastern edge of the water pipeline loop is the existing potable water pipeline within 2nd Avenue. Sewer pipelines and manholes will be installed in the parcel (within easements) that carry sewage flows to the northern edge of the parcel and then into a previously constructed (by the master developer) main sewer pipeline that will carry the flow to the west, eventually discharging into MRWPCA's interceptor system through MCWD's Fort Ord flume structure.

The University Village Apartments project has obtained the land and all entitlements for their development, including at least 13.16-AFY of potable water, from the Dunes on Monterey Bay master development.

The new infrastructure being transferred to the District will be constructed within the public right-of-way or within easements provided to MCWD by the University Village Associates. The specific infrastructure proposed for transfer includes PVC potable water pipelines, PVC gravity sewer pipelines, and associated sewer manholes, water valves, and other appurtenances. No recycled water system components constructed by this project is intended for ownership by MCWD; however, the landscape irrigation system will be plumbed appropriately for receiving recycled water at some moment in the future.

Environmental Review Compliance: A CEQA EIR for the University Villages Specific Plan was completed and adopted by the City of Marina. Any additional CEQA actions related to the site construction is the responsibility of the project owner.

Phase 1B Retail Project

Detailed Description: The Board of Directors is requested to approve a Construction and Transfer of Water, Sewer, and Recycled Water Infrastructure Agreement (hereafter referred to as the Infrastructure Agreement) between MCWD and Marina Community Partners (MCP) for the Dunes Phase 1B Retail Project.

Marina Community Partners is proposing to expand their Dunes on Monterey Bay master development located on lands of the former Fort Ord in Marina, CA. The Dunes Phase 1B Retail Project consists of the new construction of the underground utilities, roadways, and other infrastructure and appurtenances for a section of the master development termed Phase 1B. Once the Dunes Phase 1B Retail Project site is prepared, the Project will contain 5 structures for retail businesses and, potentially, a restaurant, a movie theater, and a park-area commons termed the "village square."

The Dunes on Monterey Bay development (formerly known as University Villages) owned by MCP is a fully entitled development within the land-use jurisdiction of the City of Marina. The Dunes on Monterey Bay master development has received from the City an allocation of 593-AFY of potable water. Of that total allocated amount, the Dunes Phase 1B Retail Project as proposed will use an estimated amount of at least 11.12-AFY of potable water.

The new infrastructure being transferred to the District will be constructed within the public right-of-way or within easements provided to MCWD by MCP. The specific infrastructure proposed for transfer includes PVC potable water pipelines, PVC recycled water pipelines (purple pipes), PVC gravity sewer pipelines, and associated sewer manholes, water valves, and other appurtenances.

The Infrastructure Agreement for this project contains differences between the standard Board-accepted template for Infrastructure Agreements and this version proposed for your approval. The new language is comes largely at the request of MCP and has been carefully reviewed by staff and District Counsel. The specific sections of this Infrastructure Agreement that differ substantially from the template version include:

Section 2. Design and Construction Requirements (specifically sections 2.1.1 and 2.1.4);

Section 4. District to Serve Development;

Section 11. As-Built Plans, Specifications, Values, Etc.;

Section 12. Indemnity, Insurance, and Sureties;

Section 13. Transfer of System Facilities to District after Completion;

Section 15. Warranties; and

Section 18. Assignment.

Also, a new Section 33. Acceptances, Approvals, Consents, and Verifications, has been added.

Environmental Review Compliance: A CEQA EIR for the University Villages Specific Plan was completed and adopted by the City of Marina.

Prior Committee or Board Action: On January 10, 2007, the Board adopted Resolution No. 2007-03 approving an Infrastructure Agreement between Marina Community Partners, LLC and MCWD for the University Villages Development, Phases 1B and 1C.
