Draft Minutes Joint Meeting Water Conservation Commission/Community Outreach Committee November 7, 2013

1. Call to Order:

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. Commission members Dan Amadeo, David Brown, Grace Silva-Santella, JoAnn Cannon, and Jan Shriner were present. Jan Shriner was present from the Community Outreach Committee. Brian True and Paul Lord were present from staff.

2. Public Comments on Any Item Not on the Agenda:

No comments were made.

3. Approve the October 3, 2013 Meeting Minutes:

Commissioner Cannon inquired on the Prop 218 protest hearings. Mr. True answered that the Ord Community protest hearing was held on October 21st and the Central Marina protest hearing will be held on November 18th.

Commissioner Cannon made a motion to accept the minutes of October 3, 2013. Director Shriner seconded the motion. The motion was passed with 3-Ayes, 0-Noes, 2-Abstentions, and 2-Absent.

4. Review Data for Gallons-per-Capita-Day (GPCD) Water Use Within the Ord Community and Central Marina Service Areas:

The Commission reviewed the daily per capita water use charts and discussed the possible causes of water use fluctuation between 2002 and 2011, which include several developments on the Ord Community and water for the golf course.

5. Conduct a Joint Session with MCWD's Public Outreach Committee to Consider Developing Outreach Opportunities Using Water Conservation:

There was consensus that the following four ideas/projects should be the priority focus for ongoing activities and tasks:

- 1) Recruit Commissioner Cannon to reach-out to CSUMB for ideas to engage willing students to conduct a Water Conservation themed Cap-Stone Project, or use Water Conservation as a Service Learning opportunity, or generate a newsletter, or create a Water Conservation web-site, or any number of other ideas. Key objectives in undertaking this task would be to learn how the various programs work within CSUMB and how the Water Conservation Commission can move towards implementing the selected idea(s) within that framework.
- 2) Identify and reach-out to the major water-users within MCWD's service areas and engage with them towards the objective of obtaining their cooperation in water conservation and participating in MCWD's Water Conservation programs.

Agenda Title: Conduct a Joint Session with MCWD's Public Outreach Committee to Consider

Developing Outreach Opportunities Using Water Conservation

Detailed Description: The Commission will conduct a joint session with MCWD's Public Outreach Committee. The session intends to explore opportunities for public outreach using Water-Conservation-themed vehicles across any potential media-method or activity. This topic is carried-over from the October 2013 and November 2013 meetings.

- 2) Identify and reach-out to the major water-users within MCWD's service areas and engage with them towards the objective of obtaining their cooperation in water conservation and participating in MCWD's Water Conservation programs.
