Agenda Title: Adopt Resolution No. 2014-31 to Approve a Memorandum of Understanding

between Marina Coast Water District and the Monterey Peninsula Unified School

District Regarding the In-School Water Conservation Education Program

Detailed Description: The Board of Directors shall consider adopting Resolution No. 2014-31 approving a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Marina Coast Water District (MCWD) and the Monterey Peninsula Unified School District (MPUSD) regarding the In-School Water Conservation Education Program.

The MPUSD and MCWD have worked together for more than twelve years to bring water conservation education to students in the district's service area. This agreement continues this long-standing relationship between the two partners and provides the means to integrate water conservation instruction into the curriculum at five elementary schools for the 2014-2015 School Year. The primary goal of this program is to educate the local children about earth science, the properties of water, and the importance of practicing water conservation every day.

Teacher survey results, and positive feedback from school administrators, students, and their families, indicate that unique and effective professional classroom instruction is provided through this education program (see attached). The MCWD conservation education program is valued by MPUSD school faculty and staff, and the local community it serves. Results of a 2008 study of the program's effectiveness were very positive (see attached). The 2008 study clearly indicated student knowledge and comprehension of water conservation and science increased following classroom instruction.

MCWD will reimburse MPUSD for the classroom instruction at a rate of \$30.08 per hour plus statutory benefits, not to exceed \$25,800. An accredited, experienced, MPUSD Science Teacher will conduct approximately 160 classroom presentations, providing targeted instruction to over 1200 students, and 60 teachers three times each school year. The water conservation instruction provided is designed to meets the state academic curriculum standards and it is age appropriate for the children taught in grades kindergarten through third grade.

Subject: 1st and 2nd Quarter 2014 Ord Community Water Consumption and Sewer Flow Reports

Summary: The Board of Directors is requested to receive the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2014 Ord Community Water Consumption and Sewer Flow Reports. Quarterly water consumption reports have been submitted to the Board since 2006. The quarterly consumption reports contain the Ord Community water consumption data organized by land-use jurisdiction.

This staff report also includes tracking information on Ord Community sewer flows and available sewer capacity. Ord Community sanitary sewer flow for the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2014 was 80.307-million-gallons which yield an average daily sewer flow of 0.892-million-gallons-perday (MGD). 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter flow was 75.06-million-gallons which yield an average daily sewer flow of 0.825 MGD. The Ord Community's sanitary sewer flow to the Monterey Regional Water Pollution Control Agency (MRWPCA) interceptor system is measured by a District flume structure located adjacent to the retired Main Garrison wastewater treatment plant.

The District maintains sewage conveyance capacity within the Ord Community equivalent to 3.3-MGD. The 3.3-MGD capacity managed by the District is further divided into 1.1-MGD for use by the US Army and 2.2-MGD for use by others in the Ord Community.

Below are informational annotations for the data included in the reports:

- The number of customers in each category is defined as the number of active accounts within that land use jurisdiction.
- "Army Facilities & Businesses Ord" captures all uses not listed in the other Army categories.
- Unmetered water use under "Army Facilities & Business Ord" is based on 764 flat rate accounts.

#### 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter 2014

- The rainfall total for the 1st quarter of 2014 (Jan., Feb., Mar.) was 5.84 inches. This amount of rainfall is much lower than the historical quarterly average rainfall of 9.49 inches. Precipitation for the past nine months of the Rain Year is 7.47 inches. Normal rainfall for this period is 14.39 inches.
- The measured reference evapotranspiration rate for this period was 6.86 inches, slightly higher than the historical quarterly average of 6.11 inches.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2014

- The rainfall total for the 2nd quarter of 2014 (Apr., May, Jun.) was 1.08 inches. This amount of rainfall is 0.58 inches lower than the historical quarterly average. Precipitation for the past Rain Year is 8.55 inches. Normal rainfall for the Rain Year is 16.29 inches.
- The measured reference evapotranspiration rate for this quarterly period was 12.99 inches, lower than the historical quarterly average of 13.63 inches.
