Agenda Title: Discussion Regarding District Private Fire Service Fees

Detailed Description: On July 21, 2014, several members of the public spoke during Oral Communications regarding their recent bills which included charges for their private fire service lines. The recently adopted fees and budget included increased charges in private fire service fees and took effect July 1, 2014. These fees were included as part of the District's rate study and noticed through the Proposition 218 process.

Staff has met with some of the concerned business owners and continues to work toward a resolution. On August 18, 2014 staff provided the Board with an update on the fire service fee and promised to bring back more information.

Staff has conducted a field audit of the number of fire services that exist in each cost center. The adjusted current fire service count is contained in Table 1, along with a review of how the new service count would impact rates for each cost center.

The attached Carollo September 2014 memo provides additional details of how the District arrived at current fire service charges.

The attached Revenue Impact Spreadsheet shows alternative results of adjusting the current fire service fees.

While the number of fire services in the Central Marina Cost Center went up, the number of equivalent units actually went down, thus increasing the potential individual cost per fire service. Staff does not recommend increasing the fire service fees based on the new tally. Additionally, the District can not increase costs without conducting another 218 process.

The number of fire services in the Ord Cost Center did go up, along with the number of equivalent units, thereby decreasing the cost per individual fire service. Staff recommends that the Board authorize staff to prepare a resolution reducing the fire service fees to the Ord Community based on the field verified tally conducted in September 2014. New fire service fees are outlined in Column 7 of Table 1, attached.

During the field audit it was noticed that a number of fire services are smaller than the laterals that they are connected too. For example, a six inch lateral could be providing service to a four inch fire service. Similar situations are encountered in residential service where a one inch lateral is installed to provide service with a 3/4" meter. In the situation of residential services, the District bills the customer based on the size of the meter, not the size of the lateral. A similar proposal could be made for fire services, whereby the fee imposed is based on the size of the fire service, not the fire lateral. The logic behind this arrangement is that a four inch fire service can

only use four inches worth of water, regardless of the lateral it is connected too. The cost impact to the District is unknown at this time. The District would need to conduct a public relations campaign to alert existing fire service customers to the change in policy and ask them to asset us in verifying the size of their fire service, not lateral.

Additional complications arise when a single fire service provides protection to multiple buildings and/or multiple customers. A reasonable accommodation may be to charge the fee based on the aggregate size of the combined fire services to each building. Staff would need to review options and bring back a recommendation, along with a draft policy for Board discussion.

Shortage Contingency Plan, and Resolution No. 2014-34 to Declare Water Conservation Stage 3 as required by the State Water Resource Control Board's

Emergency Mandatory Water Conservation Regulations

Detailed Description: The State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCB) Emergency Mandatory Water Conservation Regulations (Emergency Regulations) went into effect on July 29, 2014. Since MCWD supplies more than 3,000 acre-feet of water annually, it is classified as an "urban water supplier" pursuant to Water Code Section 10617. The Emergency Regulations specifically require the following:

To promote water conservation, each urban water supplier shall implement all requirements and actions of the stage of its water shortage contingency plan that imposes mandatory restrictions on outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes or turf with potable water.

Under the District's Water Shortage Contingency Plan (District Plan), mandatory restrictions on outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes or turf with potable water are not required until Water Conservation Stage 3.

Water Code Section 10632 required the District to adopt an Urban Water Shortage Contingency Plan in response to water supply shortages. Since the triggering mechanisms for the various Stages of the District Plan relate more to catastrophic interruption of water supply or seawater intrusion rather than State-wide drought, staff has revised the water shortage contingency plan as needed to include a drought response. The revised draft plan also includes updated references to the relevant provisions of the Water Code, and text changes to clarify the difference between triggers and conservation measures. A tracked-changes comparison of the current and proposed plans is provided.

The Water Shortage Contingency Plan is a mandatory element of the District's Urban Water Management Plan. The District has adopted these plans under separate resolutions. Therefore, updating the Water Shortage Contingency Plan does not require re-adoption of the Urban Water Management Plan. The updated Water Shortage Contingency Plan must be provided to the State Department of Water Resources for their files.

In addition to a table of water use restrictions, Water Conservation Stage 3 also requires the District to prescribe an allotted quantity of water per billing cycle for each water service connection and to not issue building permits or install new meters for new accounts that had not received building permits before the "Severe Shortage" was declared. Since an actual "Severe Shortage" does not exist, District staff recommends that these two Stage 3 requirements **not** be

implemented at this time but that the remainder of the table of Stage 3 water use restrictions be implemented at this time. Environmental Review Compliance: None required. Resolution No. 2014-34 Resolution of the Board of Directors Marina Coast Water District

Declaring Water Conservation Stage 3 as Required by the State Water Resource Control Board's Emergency Mandatory Water Conservation Regulations

RESOLVED by the Board of Directors ("Directors") of the Marina Coast Water District ("MCWD"), at a regular meeting duly called and held on October 6, 2014, at 211 Hillcrest Avenue, Marina, California as follows:

WHEREAS, the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) adopted Mandatory Water Conservation Regulations (Emergency Regulations), which went into effect on July 29, 2014; and,

WHEREAS, the District supplies more than 3,000 acre-feet of water annually and, therefore, the District is classified as an "urban water supplier" pursuant to Water Code Section 10617; and,

WHEREAS, the Emergency Regulations specifically require the following:

To promote water conservation, each urban water supplier shall implement all requirements and actions of the stage of its water shortage contingency plan that imposes mandatory restrictions on outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes or turf with potable water.

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2014, the District adopted a Water Shortage Contingency Plan (District Plan) pursuant to Water Code Section 10632; and,

WHEREAS, under the District Plan, mandatory restrictions on outdoor irrigation of ornamental landscapes or turf with potable water are not required until Stage 3; and,

WHEREAS, the District' water supply is not actually experiencing a severe water shortage; and,

WHEREAS, the Emergency Regulations require the Board of Directors to declare a Water Conservation Stage 3 even though the District is not actually experiencing a severe water shortage.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Marina Coast Water District does hereby do the following:

1. Declare a Water Conservation Stage 3 under the District Plan as mandated by the SWRCB.

- 2. Find that since the District's water supply is not actually experiencing a severe water shortage, the following Stage 3 requirements shall **not** be implemented at this time, but shall be subject to periodic review by the Board of Directors:
- a. "Each water service connection shall receive an allotted quantity of water, typically specified in hundred cubic feet (hcf) units per billing cycle."
- b. "No building permits will be issued or meters installed for new accounts that had not received building permits before the 'Severe Shortage' was declared."
- 3. The Stage 3 mandatory water use restrictions set forth in the District Plan's restrictions table for Stage 3 shall be implemented effective with the adoption of this Resolution.
- 4. Direct staff to notify all customers in writing of this decision within 10 days of the date of adoption.

Understanding between Marina Coast Water District and the Monterey Peninsula Unified School District Regarding the In-School Water Conservation Education

Program

Detailed Description: The Board of Directors shall consider adopting Resolution No. 2014-31 approving a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Marina Coast Water District (MCWD) and the Monterey Peninsula Unified School District (MPUSD) regarding the In-School Water Conservation Education Program.

The MPUSD and MCWD have worked together for more than twelve years to bring water conservation education to students in the district's service area. This agreement continues this long-standing relationship between the two partners and provides the means to integrate water conservation instruction into the curriculum at five elementary schools for the 2014-2015 School Year. The primary goal of this program is to educate the local children about earth science, the properties of water, and the importance of practicing water conservation every day.

Teacher survey results, and positive feedback from school administrators, students, and their families, indicate that unique and effective professional classroom instruction is provided through this education program (see attached). The MCWD conservation education program is valued by MPUSD school faculty and staff, and the local community it serves. Results of a 2008 study of the program's effectiveness were very positive (see attached). The 2008 study clearly indicated student knowledge and comprehension of water conservation and science increased following classroom instruction.

MCWD will reimburse MPUSD for the classroom instruction at a rate of \$30.08 per hour plus statutory benefits, not to exceed \$25,800. An accredited, experienced, MPUSD Science Teacher will conduct approximately 160 classroom presentations, providing targeted instruction to over 1200 students, and 60 teachers three times each school year. The water conservation instruction provided is designed to meets the state academic curriculum standards and it is age appropriate for the children taught in grades kindergarten through third grade.

Prior Committee or Board Action: The MCWD Water Conservation Commission has recommended approval of this MOU. On August 4, 2014, the Board reviewed this item and had a split vote of 2-2 with one absent. On August 6, 2014, Director Shriner requested to bring it back on September 2nd.
