August 3 - 7 and Looking Ahead to August 10 - 14

Activities During the Week of August 3 - 7: What's Being Accomplished?

PRE-CONSTRUCTION

- Completed potholing on Marina Heights Rd., 9th St., and Coe Ave.
- MPE is preparing their staging area (at the end of Crescent Ave.) for receiving materials

Upcoming Activity: What's Going to Happen Next Week?

PRE-CONSTRUCTION

- Begin open trench pipe installation on Beach Road beginning at Del Monte.

Advanced signage will be posted for the work zones. Traffic control for the work area will restrict the roadway to one lane and flaggers will be on-site directing traffic. Work hours are 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM)

Future Construction Activity and Information: What's Planned to Happen and When?

- Recycled water pipeline installation on Carmel Ave. is expected to begin the week of August 17 and continue into the third week of November.

Traffic control for the work area restricted the roadway to one lane. Flaggers will be on-site directing traffic.
