

Marina Garden Tour Scheduled for May 8 You're Invited to View Private and Public Gardens

On May 8 from 10 AM to 2 PM, the Marina Tree & Garden Club will host its seventh annual, selfguided Marina Garden Tour.

The tour features nine private Marina gardens and a native and drought tolerant public garden. During the tour, we encourage you to visit the Marina Coast Water District's Water-Wise Landscape Demonstration Garden and conservation booth at 2840 Fourth Avenue, just off Imjin Avenue.

Featured gardens on the tour include an all-succulent and cactus garden, an installation featuring a koi pond and recycled rain water, perennial gardens, fruit trees,



and a garden featuring materials salvaged from the Last Chance Mercantile. Tour maps cost \$15, or \$12 for members

of the Marina Tree and Garden Club. Tickets may be purchased in advance by calling Dana at 831-682-8016, or they may be purchased on the day of the tour at the Marina Coast Water District well site, located at the corner of Reservation Road and Salinas Avenue.

Check Your Irrigation System to Save \$ Free Consultations Available

Now is good time to check your irrigation scheduling and system components. You should repair misaligned heads, check for leaks, and clean and adjust spray nozzles and drippers to assure efficiency and prevent overspray.

If you know the monthly evapotranspiration (ET) rate, plant water requirements, and soil type for your particular site, you can calculate the proper amount of water to apply. You can save a substantial amount of water by following the schedule and making adjustments to the duration and frequency of your water applications. To help you, an irrigation schedule for our climate is available on our website at <u>www.mcwd.org</u>.

Rebates for Home Hot Water Recirculation Systems Retrofitting — \$250 Rebates

Marina Coast Water District has begun a rebate program to help homeowners save water. By retrofitting your home's hot water plumbing with a hot water recirculation system, you can speed hot water delivery and reduce water waste.

To qualify for a rebate you must have us take a quick look before you start. You can get a rebate, of up to \$250, for a hot water recirculation system retrofit. To determine your eligibility for this rebate, we must first meet with you to review the work to be done and to complete a Water Use Survey. This offer is limited by the availability of funds. Upgrade to High-Efficiency Toilets — Save Money & Water Rebates Up to \$125

You can receive a rebate of up to \$125 for retrofitting your old toilet and replace it with a single or dual-flush toilet having a flush volume of 1.28 gallons or less. Manufactures are offering a wide selection of these efficient toilets. Before purchasing a toilet, read the label carefully to make sure you are getting a high-efficiency toilet and keep the original receipt so that you will be eligible for the rebate. High-Efficiency Clothes Washers Help You Save Rebates Up To \$125

The Marina Coast Water District is offering a rebate for high efficiency clothes washers. The rebate is provided to encourage customers to replace old washers with modern high efficiency washers. Depending on the efficiency of the washer purchased, the District will offer you a \$50, \$100 or \$125 rebate. Please submit the original receipt.
